Chickens


The Christmas holiday is approaching fast. If anyone is able to feed the chickens at any time during the holiday could they please see Mrs Kenyon. Many thanks.

Beccles Royal Gymnastics Competition


Well done to Edie Vass who won a gold medal in her first gymnastics competition with the Beccles Royals.
